2.2. Format of the competition

- **Competition I – Senior and Junior Qualification for CII and CIII**

1st day, Wednesday, October 23rd – 1st Exercise - Qualification for C II and C III

2nd day, Thursday, October 24th – 2nd Exercise - Qualification for C II and C III

- The top 8 proceed to a final. If there are less than 12 entries in a category, only 6 proceed to the final.
- No more than 1 pair or group from each federation, in each category, is allowed to proceed to the individual or all-around final.
- Tie break rules [see UEG art 2.7.1 and 2.7.2] will apply for individual final. Should there be a tie for All-Around finals between participants from the same country [see UEG art 2.7.1 and 2.7.2] will be applied using the sum of both exercises [Dynamic and Balance CI].

- **Competition II – Senior and Junior - Balance and Dynamic Individual Finals**

4th day, Saturday, October 26th – 1st Exercise

5th day, Sunday, October 27th – 2nd Exercise

- The competition starts from mark of zero. Competitors with highest score in each category are declared European Champions in Balance or Dynamic Exercise.

- **Competition III – Senior and Junior All-Around Final**

3rd day, Friday, October 25th – Combined Exercise

- In this competition no more than 1 pair or group from each federation, in each category, participate in this final. The total scores from CI and CIII will be added, and the competitors with highest total score will be declared the All Around European Champions.

2.3. Competition I – Balance and Dynamic - Qualification (CI)

- The starting order for the competition is made according to the draw of lots carried out in Berlin, on the 24th of August 2013, by the UEG Acrobatic Technical Committee. (Appendix 7 and 8)
- Seniors, in accordance with FIG/UEG Regulations.
- Juniors, in accordance with FIG/UEG Regulations for Age Group 13-19. These events [senior and junior] can be entered by all pairs or groups intending to qualify for Competition II and to receive a ranking for all-around title.
- Competitors may enter Balance and/or Dynamic individual competitions.
- The top 8 proceed to a final. If there are less than 12 entries in a category, only 6 proceed to the final.
- No more than 1 pair or group from each federation, in each category, is allowed to proceed to the individual or all-around final.

2.4. Competition II – Balance and Dynamic Individual Finals (CII)

- The starting order for the competition is made according to the draw of lots carried out in Berlin, on the 24th of August 2013, by the UEG Acrobatic Technical Committee. (Appendix 7 and 8)
- Seniors, in accordance with FIG/UEG Regulations.
- Juniors, in accordance with FIG/UEG Regulations for Age Group 13-19.
- The competition starts from mark of zero. The pairs or groups with the highest score in each category are declared European Champions.



2.5. Competition III – All-Around Final (CIII)

- The starting order of the competition is made according to the draw of lots carried out in Berlin, on the 24th of August 2013, by the UEG Acrobatic Technical Committee. (Appendix 7 and 8)
- Seniors, in accordance with FIG/UEG Regulations.
- Juniors, in accordance with FIG/UEG Regulations for Age Group 13-19.
- This event can be entered by all pairs or groups providing they have taken part in CI.
- Not more than 1 pair or group from each federation, in each category, is allowed to proceed to the all-around finals.
- Difficulty for seniors will be calculated in accordance with the FIG conversion table for the combined exercise.
- The total scores from CI and CIII will be used to rank the competitors. The competitors with highest total scores from competitions I and III will be declared the winners and all-around European Champions.

2.6. Access to the competition area

- The competition area is accessible to members of the various juries, competing gymnasts and their accredited coaches, to the auxiliary personnel of the Jury, the official UEG doctor, the official OC doctor, team doctors and medical staff. A team medical person is permitted to accompany the gymnasts and coaches during all Competitions.
- Persons concerned with the apparatus.
- Interpreters may not enter the competition area without the permission of the President of the UEG ACRO-TC. The competition area is strictly forbidden to all other persons.
- The use of any kind of electronic devices (video, mobile phones, etc.) is strictly forbidden in the competition area

13.1 Sanctions. [UEG Technical Regulations 2013]

If a mobile phone or any other electronic communication device should be used on the field of play during the entire competitions of the European Championships, the person concerned (gymnast, coach, etc.) will be immediately expelled. The gymnasts will not be ranked and not be authorized to participate in the remaining competitions.

If this rule is violated by a coach, all his gymnasts who are at the moment of the violation on the field of play will also be expelled! The decision is made by the Jury of Appeal following the advice of the Superior Jury.

2.7. Award ceremonies

- All award ceremonies will take place after each session of finals. It will be carried out in accordance with the UEG Regulations for Award Ceremonies.
- The medal winners must participate in the medal award ceremony in competition attire.
- On the podium, awards will only be presented to the medal winners as follows:
 - All-Around Final (CIII) Pairs or Groups ranked 1st to 3rd place.
 - Individual Final (CII) Pairs or Groups Ranked 1st to 3rd place.

2.8. Apparatus supplier

- The apparatus supplier of these European Championships is Gymnova. The color of the floor is cream and red.
 - 1 in competition area
 - 2 in training area (one with music)
 - 4 mats (14mx4m) for stretching



2.9. Scoring and distribution of results

- Comograma scoring system will provide the official scoring service and management of the start lists, scores and results.
- The scores of the exercises will be published on an electronic display board indicating the name of the gymnast, the execution, artistry, difficulty and final scores as well as the penalties.
- The secretary of the competition will provide, after each competition, the following information through the delegation boxes in the OC office.
 - List of ranking after Competition I in balance (senior and junior)
 - List of ranking after Competition I in dynamic (senior and junior)
 - List of qualified gymnasts for Competition II (senior and junior)
 - List of qualified gymnasts for Competition III (senior and junior)
 - List of ranking after Competition II in balance (senior and junior)
 - List of ranking after Competition II dynamic (senior and junior)
 - List of ranking after Competition III (senior and junior)
- At the end of the competition all delegations will be provided with a complete set of results for all competitions.

2.10. Pictorial declaration of exercises

- Delegations are asked to submit 1 copy of each exercise during the accreditation on Sunday, 20th October. (appendix 4)
- Only tariff sheets as published in the current FIG Code of Points will be accepted. The following rules will apply:
 - showing the page number, the element number and value (computer filled if possible)
 - drawn in the order in which elements will be performed;
 - incomplete or incorrect sheets will be returned to the Head of Delegation or the Team judge;
 - late submission will incur a penalty in accordance with 48.2 FIG Code of Points;
 - Requests from CJP / Difficulty Judges relating to clarification of the tariff sheets will be posted in a designated place and coaches are required to make themselves available to explain any contentious submissions. Information will be given at accreditation.

2.11. Tables of conversion

- Difficulty for **seniors** will be calculated in accordance with the FIG Tables of Conversion:
 - CI and CII – tables of conversion for balance and dynamic in senior exercise.
 - CIII – tables of conversion for combined in senior exercise.
- Difficulty for **juniors** will be calculated in accordance with the FIG Tables of Conversion:
 - CI and CII – tables of conversion for qualifications 13-19 in balance and dynamic exercise.
 - CII – tables of conversion for finals 13-19.

2.12. New elements

- Only elements in the Tables of Difficulty or an official newsletter can be performed for difficulty credit, any other document will not be accepted.



2.13. Competition Attire – Publicity

- Please pay attention to UEG Rules for Advertising & Publicity. Publicity or advertising on competition attire must be approved by the UEG.
- Please also pay attention to the minimum and maximum dimension of the National Emblems.

2.14. Athletes' Measuring

- Immediately following podium training on Monday, October 21st, all gymnasts must be present themselves at the Medical Office for measuring.
- In the case of obstructive behaviour or non-compliance by the gymnasts, conditions and sanction in accordance with the Article 5 of FIG Technical Regulations 2013 will be applied.

2.15. Music

- Upon arrival, the delegations must hand-in music CDs to the Organizing Committee as per the norms given in the FIG Code of Points. 2 CDs per exercise are requested.
- The following information must be written on each CD:
 - Federation (country abbreviation)
 - Name of gymnasts
 - Category (WP, MP, MXP, WG, MG)
 - Type of Exercise (Balance, Dynamic, Combined)
 - Type of the recording (mono or stereo)
 - Title of the music
 - The composer(s) of the music used
 - Total time (in minutes and seconds)
 - Gymnasts should have an extra copy for each exercise, labelled as listed above, for use in the training hall.

2.16. Doping control

- Under the supervision of the UEG, doping control will be arranged by the Organizing Committee during this competition in accordance with the valid WADA Doping Control Regulations. The doping controls may take place at any time during the training, podium training or competition times.



Part 3 - The jury

3.1. The Jury

- The CJP's were nominated by the UEG/ACRO-TC.
- The D1 judges were nominated by the UEG/ACRO-TC.
- The D2 judges will be drawn during the judge's meeting on the 17th of October 2013 by the UEG/ACRO-TC.
- The D1 and D2 judges will remain the same throughout the competition.
- The E and A judges' panels will be decided by drawing of lots. If possible, for competition C II, only judges from federations without qualified gymnasts are allowed to judge in the E-jury and A-jury.

3.2. Jury of Appeal

- The Jury of Appeal is composed of 2 members of the UEG Executive Committee (one of them acting as President) and a third person to be designated from the O.C. who was not involved in the decision of the Superior Jury and in the judging process of the apparatus.

3.4. Judges' instruction

- Instruction for all judges will be on Monday, October 20th and Tuesday, October 21st, from 11h00 to 13h00; Draw of lots for E and A jury, before start of the competition. In Accordance with the FIG/TR, attendance at the judges' meetings and instruction is mandatory.
- Judges are requested to take the Artistry and Technical judging forms to the competition (30 copies of each form). Failure to bring those copies will result in delegation having to pay the printed price to the OC. (appendix 2 and 3)
- The judges' instruction will be held in English.
- The judges' oath will be carried out during the opening ceremony by one judge of the host federation (Portuguese language) and by one judge from one invited federation (English language).



3.5. Judges' meetings

- The judges' meetings will take place in the judge's room before the start of each session.

3.6. Inquiries procedure

- In accordance with the UEG TR, Art. 6 *inquiries of the score*.

3.7. Tie Break Rules

- Tie break rules [see UEG art 2.7.1 and 2.7.2] will apply for individual final. Should there be a tie for All-Around finals between participants from the same country [see UEG art 2.7.1 and 2.7.2] will be applied using the sum of both exercises [Dynamic and Balance CI].
- In Finals - a tie is not broken.



Part 4 - The organization of the event

4.1. Orientation meeting

- The orientation meeting for the Heads of delegation will take place on Tuesday, October 22nd, 2013 at 14h00 in the Auditorium of the Sport Hall. The OC and the ACRO-TC/UEG will give practical information on the organization and running of the competition.
- The presence of the participating National Federations at the orientation meeting is compulsory. A maximum of 2 persons per delegation is allowed, including the Head of delegation. Unjustified failure by a federation to attend will result in a sanction of 1000. - Euro.
- Advertising on the gymnasts' competition attire has to be presented to the UEG for approval.
- The Heads of Delegation must present confirmation as to who is authorized to make inquiries.

4.2. Training information

- A detailed program of the training schedule will be provided to the participating National Federation at accreditation.

4.3. Delegation

- In accordance with the 2013 UEG Technical Regulation the maximum composition of the delegation for the Acrobatics European Championships is as follows:

- Different types of accreditations are also available. Please consult the guidelines.
- Gymnasts who do not have a valid FIG License (or the validity of the license is expired) are not allowed to compete. All licenses will be checked by the OC after the nominative inscriptions.



4.4. Accreditation

- In order to accelerate the accreditation procedure, please send to the Organizing Committee a photo of each delegation member (electronic format) together with the Nominative Registration. 10€ will be charged for each photo the OC has to take at the arrival of the delegation.
- The specification of the photo should be as follows:
 - File format: JPG, JPEG
 - File name: NOC_Surname_Firstname (ex: POR_SANTOS_Rita.jpg)
- The accreditation is personal, non-transferable and compulsory to control access to training, competition hall, functions and official transport. It identifies individuals participating in the Championships and ensures controlled access to each area.
- All participants and officials are required at all times to wear Accreditation Cards and respect those personnel responsible for monitoring entry.
- The address of the accreditation centre is as follows:

- At accreditation process the Head of Delegation or his representative must provide to the organizing committee the following:
 - Tariff sheets (appendix 4) for all competitors [only one copy of each exercise is required]. Sheets that are not completed correctly will be returned to the Head of Delegation or delegated team Judge;
 - Check and confirm the correct names of their complete delegation;
 - Verify accommodation requirements;
 - Present passports of all competitors and judges for the control of Nationality and age;
 - Present the FIG licenses of the gymnasts;
 - Confirm the medical insurance for all the members of the delegation;
 - Prove that they fulfilled their financial obligation to the O.C.;
 - The completed music form and 2 copies of competitor's music. The CD's will be returned to the Heads of Delegation after the gymnasts' last competition. It is recommended that spare CD be brought for safety reasons;
 - Music Form if don't send till September 16th 2013 (appendix 5);
 - National flag and anthem (clearly marked with the name of the country);
 - Accreditation for the EAGG is not valid for ECh for Juniors and Seniors;
 - For the accreditation process, only the Head of Delegation (or his representative) is requested to present him/her self at the accreditation centre;
 - All participants and officials are required to wear the Accreditation Card at all time. The accreditation is personal, non-transferable and compulsory to have access to the training, warm-up and competition hall;
 - The accreditation card is also necessary to pass the security controls;
 - If lost, a new accreditation card can be purchase for 150€, with approval from UEG;
 - The access in the warm-up hall is strictly limited to the gymnasts participating in the specific competition and according to the warm-up schedule.

IMPORTANT

The accommodation offer is not compulsory, but if accommodation is not arranged through the Organizers, access to the transport will not be provided for airport transfers, training, competition, meetings and the farewell banquet. Federations who have not booked accommodation through the OC, will be charged 200 € per each delegation's member.

4.7. Meals

- Delegations who booked their accommodation through the OC have accommodation, breakfast and final banquet included in their package.
- The OC will offer a meal package for food at the competition hall.
- Age Group - 225€/person – October 20th – 27th, 2013
- Meals are served as follows:
 - Breakfast will be available at the hotels.
 - Lunch will be provided at the Sport Hall from 12h00 to 15h00.
 - Dinner will be provided at the Sport Hall from 18h00 to 21h00.
- Outstanding payment for meal packs, [the remaining 50% of the Federations who have ordered] must be paid by September 16th, 2013.
- Extra tickets for meals (30€/person/meal) can be ordered through the OC to be made by September 16th, 2013.
- Claims for refunds made later than September 16th 2013 will not be accepted.

4.8. Transportation

- The journey to Lisbon will be at each delegation's own expenses. The OC strongly recommends that each federation take cancellation insurance for their transportation.
- Accredited delegations who stay in one of the official hotels, booked their accommodation through the Organizing Committee and who will return their Travel Schedule Form (appendix 6) – indicating arrival and departure, date and time by September 16th, 2013 will be provided with a shuttle service from the Lisbon airport or train and bus stations to the Sport Hall, official's hotels, and back.
- Federations who did not book their accommodation through the Organizing Committee will not be entitled to use the transportation system and will be responsible for being on time at all events.

4.9. Competition hall

4.10. Warm-up and training halls

- The competition, training and warm-up halls are located in one building.

4.11. Delegation boxes

- Delegation Boxes will be set up in the competition hall for all participating federations. Information regarding competition, warm-up, trainings, and notification of meetings, transport, official functions as well as UEG and OC correspondences will be distributed via the delegation "mailboxes".
- A special "Mail Box" authority card will be issued to each Head of Delegation. This card must be shown by the Head of Delegations (or his representative) when collecting all information and results from their Delegation Mail Box. The delegation member designated to collect the information from the Delegation Mail Box will be required to sign for information collected.



4.12. The media/press conferences

- Media representatives (journalists, photographers, TV) must request a special accreditation from the UEG. Applicants must contact the UEG as soon as possible. The media will be assigned special seating and working conditions.
- All gymnasts have to pass through the Mixed Zone when leaving the competition area.

4.13. Medical Services

- The OC will provide medical and physiotherapist services. Doping controls will be made according FIG Anti-Doping Rules.

4.14. Control Video Recording

- All routines will be recorded on video, the videos are used in case of protest and for the evaluation of the juries.

4.15. Farewell Party

- The OC will host a farewell party for all Delegation members (provided their accommodation was booked through the OC) on the conclusion of the event on Sunday, October 27th at the Hotel Altis Park from 20.00h to 00.00h.
- The access to the party will be by accreditation card only.
- The official results as well as the Federation's diplomas will be distributed during the dinner.
- The transportation will be provided from the Sport Hall to the hotels; the bus schedule to the Farewell Party in the Altis Park, and return to the delegation's hotel are given during the accreditation.
- The minimum age for alcohol consumption is 18. Proper identification such as passport or driver's license must be shown as proof of age in order to purchase alcoholic beverages.
- The tickets for the Farewell Party must be paid to the OC by September 16th, 2013.
- Only participants and officials are allowed to participate in the farewell party

4.16. Insurance

- The host Federation, the Organizing Committee and the UEG will not be held responsible for any liabilities in case of accidents, illness or repatriation.
- The FIG Technical Regulations (Section 1, Article 12.10) foresees that all participating Federations are obliged to cover the expenses for all members of their Delegation for the necessary insurance coverage against accidents and illness.
- The Organizing Committee will verify the insurance of all countries at accreditation. Athletes without insurance will not be allowed to compete.
